After earning an MBBS from Government Calicut Medical College in 2008 and serving in Wayanad with the NRHM, Ashly pursued higher studies in anaesthesiology, eventually earning a DNB in 2018, his clinical path was one of excellence.

In 2021, Ashly and Arlene stepped into a deeper calling — joining Nav Jivan Hospital in Satbarwa, Jharkhand, as medical missionaries. They entered a region many had forgotten, where poverty was generational and dignity was rare. They saw Christ there and gave their life to the mission of their Lord.

By 2022, was appointed Managing Director; in 2024, he was appointed Managing Director. Through Ashly's visionary leadership, Nav Jivan Hospital was not just revived — it was reimagined. He dreamed of more — of a school for tribal children, where education would unlock dignity and transformation. Though he did not live to see it built, his dream remains alive, and it is now our task to carry it forward.



A worker who does not need to be ashamed

Even as we grapple with the sudden loss of a beloved fellow worker, it is soothing to know that he is no longer 'a pilgrim and a stranger on the earth' but has reached 'the city with foundations, whose builder and maker is God'.

My acquaintance with Ashley began at medical college where though from different colleges, we had the privilege to mature in Christ through the Christian Medical Fellowship, Kerala. I was always amazed by the CMF leader from Calicut who found time always amazed by the CMF leader from Calicut who found time not just to lead the fellowship but also to make friends through football and basketball, while doing well in studies. It was after internship that we shared the burden for the great need in North India, and we thought of starting a group where we could go and help out mission hospitals in turns while pursuing the PG entrance exam. Soon he got into DA while I joined Herbertpur as a JMO, thinking that the group had fizzled out. It was such a joy to receive a call from him 2 years down the lane, asking about the work at Herbertpur, and whether he could visit the place.

Thus started his saga with EHA. As a family they brought so much flavour to the community as well as to work that his time is still talked about at Herbertpur. Having spent 2 years there, he went to Ludhiana to pursue DNB while Arlene did her PG in Paediatrics.

With a heart that echoed with the burden in his Master's heart, he chose to go to Satbarwa at the end of his stint at Ludhiana. A jovial soul who found joy in the small pleasures of life, he was not one to mince words either. I remember being reprimanded by him for the way a situation was handled at our unit. But what kept him apart way a situation was nanded at our unit. But what kept him apart from all of us was his intense desire to kindle the fire in his heart for the lost. Even when medical work was overwhelming, he often wondered whether we are in the business of 'curing' or 'healing'. Our discussions would invariably have a challenge from him that it is not the number of surgeries done or MIs thrombolysed but the number of souls saved that really matters.

Somebody who literally sold himself out for His cause, he exemplified Paul's saying that he 'became all things to all men so that by all possible means he might be able to save some.' One who would never refer a patient, he would often put me to shame by the amount of medical work he was doing at Sabbarwa. What many would not accomplish in a decade or more, he has already done in his short time there. Though himself being stressed, he was quick to advise me to take care of myself in a recent conversation. The last phone call we had 4 days ago was about managing an Ortho case in casualty. He ended the call commending me for a decision that I had made.

He was a worker who never had to be ashamed, approved of God. Though the void he has left all of a sudden is not going to be filled easily, he has left a legacy for all of us who are yet to finish the race to embrace and continue the good work that the Master has kept beforehand for each one of us. May each of us be at the end of the race - a worker who does not have to be ashamed, approved of
